

Current Transmissions features over 40 artists commissioned in 2019 as part of New Creatives, a national talent development scheme co-funded by BBC Arts and Arts Council England.

All the works in Current Transmissions were developed by the artists with mentoring and production support provided by the ICA and partners Chisenhale Gallery, Dazed Media, NTS, SPACE, the Visible Institute at Kingston School of Art and Werkflow.
