Filmmaker Nasib Nasibi (1940-2004) was a pioneer of avant-garde cinema in Iran. His work is defined by its unique combination of poetry and cinema, particularly his use of Iranian avant-garde and modernist poems. With his brother Basir, Nasibi helped start the Cinemaye Azad movement (1969-1979). Now considered one of the most important avant-garde films, Che Harasi Darad Zolmat E Rooh tells the story of a tired and bored girl who sells her heart to the devil in order to be reborn in another world.

All the actors in Che Harasi Darad Zolmat E Rooh were members of the Theatre Workshop (*Kargah-e Namayesh*). In developing the screenplay, in addition to incorporating poems by six poets from the *Poetry of Volume* movement, Nasibi collaborated with Abbas Nalbandian on the film's dialogues. As Nasibi noted:

"A work becomes art for me when it comes close to poetry. In some moments of my new film, the dialogues are taken from poems I love. I have always believed that a poet must rain an essence upon me, so that I feel the vastness of the earth is my homeland."
